German Language Courses	
German Language Courses for Erasmus students Application	 Students staying for a whole semester may take part in a German language course. 4 hrs per week equals 3 ECTS-credits that can be included in the transcript of records upon agreement with the Erasmus departmental coordinator free of charge Student who wish to participate in a German language course need to state this in their online-application. Further information on placement test and the course will be send to students by mail.

Formalities	
Visa	Students with Israeli nationality do not require a visa to enter Germany.
	They however need to apply for a residence permit to the Immigration Office in Germany after their arrival when staying longer than 3 months in Germany. The International Office will support them in doing this.
Passport	Students need a passport valid for the whole period of their stay and preferably 6 months beyond.

Insurance	The Erasmus program does not include any insurance.
Health insurance	Students need to provide proof of a sufficient health insurance which covers the whole study abroad period for their enrolment at the University of Bonn.
	 a) This might be a private international health insurance. Please note: Health insurance policies will not be accepted if the coverage is not equivalent to the coverage of a German compulsory health insurance! This must cover urgent cases of sickness and accidents, psychological treatment and, if applicable, chronic diseases, pregnancy and delivery. The coverage of repatriation costs is highly recommended. b) Students might also get a German health insurance upon arrival (cost. 103 € per month). In this case they should make sure to have a basic travel health insurance for the first few days in Germany. Please be aware that students who are older than 30 years or who already reached their 14th semester have to take out a private health insurance which is more expensive.

Liability insurance	We also recommend that students take out a third-party liability insurance to cover any accidental damages caused to other persons or property during their stay.
Accident insurance	The <u>social contribution fee</u> of ca. 300 €, which students have to pay when enrolling, includes an insurance for accidents that might occur en route from the university to your place of residence or on university grounds.

Financial Matters	
Living costs	On average: 800-1000 € per month (depending on price for accommodation)
Erasmus grant	 850 € per month 530 € travel grant first payment upon arrival: travel grant 530 € + 850 € (cash) further payments on German bank account which students need to open after arrival
Additional grant for student with special needs	Student with a handicap or attended by children can apply for a supplementary grant. Please inform us about these cases when nominating your students.
Semester ticket	All students need to pay a fee of approx. 300 € per semester when enrolling at the University of Bonn after arrival. It includes a semester ticket for public transportation for the whole semester and accident insurance. Note: This is <u>NOT</u> a tuition fee.
